Salvation is not in the scrupulous following out of carefully selected - preferred traditionalist religious devotions and prayers! Salvation is not in the superficial and capricious observance of outward acts of virtue! Salvation is not in repetitious argument and debate - which signify NOTHING! Salvation is not in the un-Catholic improperly "authenticated" countless and presentations of "Catholic" orthodoxy!

Salvation comes through faith in Christ and through the INTERIOR CHANGE that faith in Christ Crucified brings

about in the soul of man! Salvation comes from and is to be found in one's genuinely sincere love for God – the God of Love – and the living virtue generated by that love!
