Friday, June 3, 2005, is the most treasured Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus. All the remembrances of Our Blessed Lord that are known to us, from His incomprehensible Conception to His wondrous Ascension, and everything since then, can all be summed up in this one Feast of His Most Sacred Heart. This Feast is the remembrance of the infinite and **entire** Gift of Himself to us. This Feast reminds us that He has thrown open the doors of His Sacred Heart with the full strength of His infinite Love. He asks us to enter into His Heart. The Heart of Jesus is literally **consumed** for us.

The love of Christ for us, the love of the Second Person of the Blessed Trinity for us – let us say it as it is – is so tremendous, that in actual fact it drew Him irresistibly and completely through the all-consuming agonies of His Sacred Passion. The Sacred Passion of Jesus Christ was not merely an impassioned performance. In His Sacred Passion, the fire of His love for us literally consumed Him as He was nailed to the Cross. Prior to His Death, the condition of Mankind was altogether impossible and salvation was out of the question. The love that He, the Second Person of the Most Blessed Trinity – Himself God – had for lost Mankind forced Him to give Himself as ransom for Man. Man's salvation could not have been secured otherwise. To the same degree does His love for Man continue today, for He is willing to die for us each one of us every day. The salvation of Souls is eternally uppermost in His infinite Mind.

Christ is ever willing to offer His Sacrifice, and all that He asks in return is for Man to take one single step into His ever-loving Heart. Indeed, not only did He give us His Flesh as Food (which we honor in today's celebration), but He keeps the entrance to His Heart always open for us, if we will but enter. The Heart of Jesus is our only salvation! The Heart of Jesus is our only hope! The Heart of Jesus is our only peace! The Heart of Jesus is our only holiness and joy!
